The redwoods of North Dakota

Let's face it. North Dakota does not have redwoods.

There was, however, a type of Sequoia that grew here 65 million years ago. But that doesn't count today.

There are some pretty big trees here, though. The largest tree is a cottonwood that is 105 feet tall, with a whopping 30-foot circumference and a crown spread of 92 feet, located in Steele County.

The tallest tree is a different cottonwood that was 115 feet in height, when it was last measured in 2017. I wonder how much taller it is now?

The largest tree and the tallest tree are not one-and-the-same, which may sound confusing. Trees are complicated things and they sometimes grow in strange ways. How do we decide what is biggest?

Everything you need to know about this topic is available in the North Dakota Forest Service's 2021 Register of Champion Trees. The Register has all of this information and more and is available online.

A formula that combines height, stem circumference and crown spread is used to rate each tree with a total number of points. The tree with the largest point value is the champion. Pretty straightforward, right? Usually.

Height is pretty straightforward. So is crown spread. Measure the spread of the crown at two places (at right angles to each other) and take the average.

Then measure the circumference of the stem. In forestry, the standard position for measuring tree circumference is 4.5 feet above the ground. While this sounds straightforward, this is where it can get tricky.

What if the stem is forked?

Should it be counted as a one tree, or is it two trees?

This question has been debated many times through the years. The arguments go around and around.

For now, the standard answer is: If the tree forks below 4.5 feet, it counts as two trees. If the fork is above 4.5 feet, it counts as a single tree.

Coming back to that formula for determining total number of points:

Total points = Height (in feet) + Circumference (in inches) + j Average Crown Spread (in feet)

The largest tree in North Dakota is that above-mentioned cottonwood in Steele County with a score of 488 points. The tallest cottonwood, located in Ransom County, scored 475 points. These trees are absolutely enormous!

While a number of the champions are located in eastern North Dakota, that's not always the case.

The largest Rocky Mountain juniper is located in McKenzie County, while the runner-up is in Slope County. The largest ponderosa pine is also in Slope County.

A number of champions are located in the Turtle Mountains as well, one of the few naturally forested areas of the state.

I've been fortunate enough to visit a number of the champion trees throughout North Dakota. Trees located on public land can be visited at any time. If a champion is located on private property, you must get permission from the landowner before going onto their property. Fortunately, landowner information is also listed in the Register.

Nomination information is also listed in the Register. If you think a tree is big enough to qualify, go for it!

"The big trees of North Dakota." I need to use that phrase more often.

Tackle, Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea: East end of Lake Sakakawea remains fair to good for walleye working shallow water in the bays or deeper out along main lake points. Try a variety of presentations

•Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea, Hwy. 83 Lawn & Leisure, Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea: Continued fair to good walleye success on the east end of Lake Sakakawea Try slow death hooks and nightcrawlers in 12 to 18 feet working main lake points around Steinke Bay and points to the west. Improving success using crankbaits in 20 to 30 feet. Not many reports from Lake Audubon with anglers focusing on Sakakawea, although smallmouth bass activity remains fair to good.

•Lake Sakakawea, Dakota Waters Resort, Beulah: Continued fair to good walleye activity in 20 to 25 feet with best success using Lindy rigs with nightcrawlers or leeches working outside lake points.

•Lake Sakakawea, Indian Hills Resort, Garrison: Fair to good for walleye with a nice morning bite. Try nightcrawlers with some success on leeches yet. Overall nice success throughout the area.

•Lake Sakakawea, New Town: Van Hook Arm remains good for walleye using a variety of presentations with success from the Arm east over to Indian Hills.

•Missouri River, Dakota Tackle, Bismarck: Van Hook Arm remains good for walleye on Lake Sakakawea. Try Missouri River tailrace for eater-sized catfish or Lake Audubon for muskie but remember 48-inch muskie minimum size limit.

•Missouri River, Enerbase of Washburn: Reports remain limited from the Missouri River. OK success on the east end of Lake Sakakawea with better success west towards Deepwater Bay.

•Missouri River System, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River tailrace producing a mix of walleye and catfish from boats during the day. Limited trout and salmon numbers. Try Lindy rigs or spinners with nightcrawlers in the spillway channel or jigging in the holes. Chutes slow during the day but look for

some catfish. Boats producing better success in the chutes at night. Try spillway pond area from shore during the day for a mix of catfish and walleye or the tailrace boat ramp. Best night success for walleye is off the rocks. Lake Sakakawea remains fair to good for walleye with lots of activity along the north shore. Move around to locate active fish working as shallow as 8 feet in the bays or deeper along main lake points. Some salmon success. Work the face of the dam over to Deadman's Bay.

•McLean Co. area lakes, Cenex of Wilton: Not as much activity on area lakes with less shore-fishing and most anglers working from boats.

•Heart River, Mandan: River stage, 0.71 feet; streamflow, 272 CFS.

•Knife River, Stanton: River stage, 8.29 feet; streamflow, 67 CFS.

•Missouri River, Williston: River stage, 4.99 feet; streamflow, 11,100 CFS.

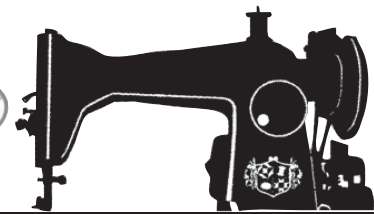

Cancer screening saved my life - Twice

PRAIRIE DOC® PERSPECTIVES

As a physician with 45 years of practice, I've seen my share of diseases. I have usually been on the physician side of the diagnosis-treatment paradigm. However, knowing the rationale for diagnostic screening tests, I fortunately did not shirk my own.

Testing too much or too frequently leads to insignificant findings that may have no long-term consequences yet create worry and further testing. Too often, this can lead to surgery that does not save lives but carries pain, disability, unnecessary expense, and sometimes post-op infection that occasionally is fatal. Knowing what and when to test is a crucial conversation to have with your doctor.

Although annual prostate-specific antigen, or PSA testing

is no longer recommended, periodic testing may raise suspicion if a rising pattern is seen. As luck would have it, this turned out to be my dilemma, so I retested six months later, and when my PSA continued to climb, I went in for a biopsy. The biopsy showed a very aggressive type of cancer, the type that metastasizes very quickly to bone. Surgery was scheduled and computed tomography or CT scans ordered to help with staging my surgery.

Even though I had had three colonoscopies in the preceding 25 years, the CT scan showed a tumor inside my colon that was only about one millimeter from breaking through the wall and spreading to other organs. An extra year of procrastinating would almost certainly have found me with two cancers that would have already spread. Catching them early, surgery was curative, and I was one of the lucky ones who did not have to undergo months of

radiation or chemotherapy.

So, please, have this discussion with your doctor, and review the American Cancer Society's screening guidelines, as these vary with age, family history, and your unique set of risk factors. Go to www.cancer.org and be proactive. Catch it early and you too can go on enjoying life with your family for years to come.

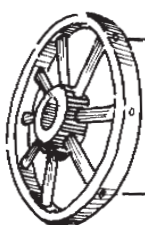

Life in a barrel
DAKOTA DATEBOOK

Pickles come in barrels and so do herring and whiskey, but could you imagine living in one? Ardell Hagen was one of many soldiers who returned home from World War II and found that there was no housing available. His parents had moved to Seattle, Washington, but his wife and daughter remained in Devils Lake and finding a place to live was a priority for the young couple and their eighteen-month-old baby. He discovered that the Barrel, a drive-in diner, had closed and was offered for sale by the owner, W.H. Muzzy, of Crookston, Minnesota.

The Barrel was part of a chain of unique, fast-food diners established during the late '20s and early '30s by Mr. Muzzy in eight cities in the northern Midwest. These were principally hamburger and soft drink stands, which capitalized on cheaper meals to feed the cash-strapped people during the depression, especially the traveling public. Designed as a huge barrel, the structure was meant to stand out among the other fast-food diners of the day.

Mr. Hagen purchased the property in late 1945 and immediately went about refurbishing the building. The Barrel was approximately sixteen feet wide and twenty feet tall and being barrel-shaped, the rooms were circular. A stove for heating

the building was located in the lower half of the structure, which was mostly used for storage, and Mr. Hagen converted the upper portion into suitable living quarters. The top floor was equipped with an electric stove, running water, a sink, and built-in cupboards along with some furnishings to aid in the comforts of life. Panels of insulation board were used on the upstairs wall and ceiling to add protection from the cold during the winter.

For eighteen months they lived in the Barrel and life was no end of going around in circles. Mr. Hagen worked for the Ferris Grocery store and, shortly after they moved in, Mrs. Hagen resumed operating the sandwich and soft drink stand in the lower half for which the building was designed. It was on this date in 1947 that their circular housekeeping days would end, and they began the move into a five-room apartment—each with four walls—an environment that would take some adjustment for the family.

For over fifty years the Barrel functioned as a hangout for teens in the Devils Lake area, and most Lake residents can recall the delicious homemade hamburgers, fries, and bakery goods. The icon stood until 1984 serving as a quick stop for thousands of people, with the exception of one unique family who learned what it was like to live life in a barrel.
