DAKOTA RECREATION REPORT

Outdoor Notes:

•Hunters reminded to put identification on tree stands and blinds when set up on N.D. Game & Fish Dept. WMAs.
 •Applications such as Onyx now have updated electronic posting information for the 2022 hunting season.
 •Sept. 24: Resident waterfowl season opens.
 •Sept. 24: Sakakawea Pheasants Forever Fall Pheasant Fest, Garrison City Auditorium, 5:30 p.m.
 •Sept. 25: Youth deer season closes.
 •Oct. 1: Nonresident waterfowl season opens.
 •Oct. 1 & 2: Youth pheasant season.

Tournaments:

•Sept. 24: Lake Sakakawea, Fort Stevenson State Park.

Fishing:

Lake Sakakawea elevation, Sept. 19: 1,834.26 feet above mean sea level; 13,800 cubic feet per second (CFS) Garrison Dam average daily releases.
 Missouri River gauge height, Stanton: River stage, 6.67 feet; streamflow.
 Missouri River gauge height, Washburn: River stage, 8.49 feet.

•N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: No new Missouri River System reports.

•Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Not many anglers on the east end of Lake Sakakawea but continue working deep water for walleye. Salmon slowed.

*Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea, Hwy. 83 Lawn & Leisure, Garrison: Lake Sakakawea still has a deep water walleye activity on the east end. Try Lindy rigs and bottom bouncers. Try morning hours for salmon. Work 30 to 40 feet on Lake Audubon for walleye, as well. Continued good smallmouth success.

*Lake Sakakawea, Dakota Waters Resort, Beulah: Better walleye activity remains farther west of Dakota Waters

in deeper water with a switch to minnows. Resort closed after Sept. 25.

•Lake Sakakawea, Indian Hills Resort, Garrison: Bait shop closed but access still available.

•Lake Sakakawea, New Town: Walleye success remains generally slow. Try working deep.

•Missouri River, Dakota Tackle, Bismarck: Some salmon activity on the east end of Lake Sakakawea casting Mepps or spoons from shore in low light conditions. Try bays around Garrison Dam. Limited Missouri River reports.

•Missouri River, Enerbase of Washburn: Not much activity on the Missouri River or area lakes, including Lake Sakakawea.

•Missouri River System, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River tailrace remains slow to fair during the day for walleye with good catfish success. Fair evening walleye bite with a mix of occasional trout and salmon and OK walleye success. Lake Sakakawea remains fair for walleye in 50 feet using a mix of nightcrawlers and minnows. Work points and move around. Salmon remain throughout the water column from shallow depths in the bays to deep water around 100 feet. Try a variety of presentations from shore or downrigging in deep water. Overall success slowed from last week.

•McLean Co. area lakes,

Cenex of Wilton: Fewer anglers on area lakes as people gear up for hunting. C-Store has targets and ammunition available.

Hunting:

•Deer: Some early season archery success with more movement around the last half hour before sunset.

•Doves: Birds still remain in the area and are bunching with cooler weather. Look for them to move as cool weather persists.

•Waterfowl: Fair duck numbers in northwest and around Devils Lake with larger wetlands still holding water. North-central N.D. wetlands generally in nice condition yet for holding water but limited crane numbers yet and not many local Canada geese. Wetlands around the midsection of Lake Sakakawea are drying, however, with limited numbers of local waterfowl.

•Upland: Some pockets of grouse but hunters generally finding more partridge than sharptails.

If weeds and grasses are not cut by this time, the Sheridan County Commission will instruct the County Road Crew or Organized Township to cut weeds. The cost of cutting such weeds and grasses in each township will be charged \$300.00 per mile and such charges shall become part of the taxes to be levied against such land for 2022. Notice is also given to all landowners and renters that no electric fencing is allowed along shoulder right of way on township or County roads and removal of bales along road right of way must be removed by November 1, 2022 or bales will be burned. Removal of any equipment along road right of way must be done by November 1, 2022 also or equipment will be towed and cost of towing will be charged to the equipment owner. Changing of the guard

The first ones I notice are the sumacs.

It's the same pattern each year. Sumacs turn a bright red, and they start changing color early. It's a bright, fire-engineered, usually. Sometimes they're a little muted, with a bit of purple mixed in.

Robins are supposed to signal the arrival of spring. For me, sumacs are the first sign of autumn. They're beautiful.

For the next few weeks, I'll watch the palette change. In North Dakota, it's a lot of yellow. You have to search for the reds and oranges, and the occasional purple. But it's worth it. They're out there.

In our native forests, red fall colors are found on shrubs and some vines. American cranberrybush, also known as highbush cranberry, is another one that turns a bright red, though it's much later than the sumac. Highbush cranberry fruit also provides a splash of red in a duller world.

Leaves of Virginia creeper, a common vine, also turn red. The vine snakes its way around tree trunks and up into the crowns, sending a streak of red through a yellow

backdrop. It's beautiful.

As I watch autumn unfold, the old biochemistry lessons come back to mind. The yellows and oranges are mainly produced by carotenoids, pigments that have been hidden all summer by chlorophyll. Photosynthesis uses chlorophyll to capture energy from the sun and turn it into sugar – an amazing process. The carotenoids play a minor role in photosynthesis and become visible once the chlorophyll begins to break down in the fall.

The chemistry behind the reds and purples is pretty remarkable as well. They're produced by compounds called anthocyanins. These compounds hook up with sugars and then put on a great show. If the cell sap is acidic (low pH), we often see red; if the sap is alkaline (high pH), the display changes to purple. It's amazing.

Various combinations of anthocyanins and carotenoids can result in yellow, orange and red leaves all on the same tree. A few years ago, I learned about bog birch (scientific name *Betula pumila*). It's a small shrub that grows in swamps and, well, bogs! Its colors are subtle but can be orange or red or some combination of them. I look at these unique

ecosystems in a whole different way now.

Many landscape painters love autumn. It gives them a chance to explore a whole different palette of color that they haven't much used for a year. Photographers love this time period as well.

Enjoy the fall colors. Explore and look for the subtle expressions of complex chemistry. We only have a few weeks to enjoy them. Sunny days result in brighter colors. Rain washes them out. And a windstorm can destroy it all, in the blink of an eye.

Ask, than Act PRAIRIE DOC® PERSPECTIVES

One summer during my college years, I had a roommate who suffered from suicidal thoughts. She'd attempted suicide before we met, and been hospitalized, but continued to struggle. Back in the late 80s, there was very little public understanding of mental health issues, and the stigma was even stronger than it is today. Our other roommate and I didn't know what to do, or where to turn.

Not surprisingly, we didn't handle it well.

However, we did one thing right: we restricted access to lethal means. We secured the knives, and took control of her medications. Back before Prozac, the best treatments were lethal if used to overdose.

It's tempting to view people with mental illness as somehow different from the rest of us. On some level, I think we expect that to mean we can't be affected. We want to believe it won't touch us.

However, suicide crosses all boundaries. Anyone can develop suicidal thoughts, so everyone needs to be able to recognize the danger signs,

and know what to do.

Risk factors for suicide include a previous suicide attempt, a family history of suicide, and a personal or family history of mental illness or substance use. Living with chronic pain or having experienced violence or abuse in the family are also significant risks. Other stressful life events, such as incarceration, a job loss, a break up, or bullying, make a difference as well.

There are often, although not always, warning signs. Watch for talk about being a burden, about feeling hopeless or worthless, about unbearable pain, and about death. There may be mood swings, anger or anxiety, withdrawal from loved ones or activities, or unusual risk taking. Sometimes the signs are more dramatic. There may be overt talk of suicide and actions that suggest preparation for

death: saying goodbye, giving away treasured possessions, drafting a will. A person might research methods of suicide and take steps to implement a plan, such as buying a gun. Don't consider talk of suicide to be a bid for attention. It is a cry for help.

Of course, recognizing risk isn't enough. We need to know what to do. The first step is to ask the question: Are you thinking about suicide? Asking won't "plant the seed." It's ok, in fact it is crucial, to ask. Try to keep the person safe by reducing access to means of suicide. Listen, and try to understand what they are thinking and feeling. Connect them to help, via the crisis line or another source of support and assistance. Stay in touch.

Emily, if you ever read this, your life matters. I wish we'd understood how to show you that.

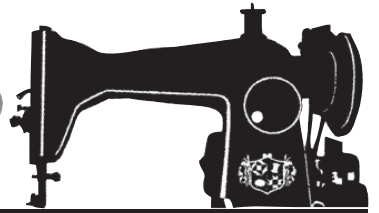

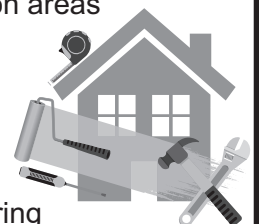

The Rise and Demise of Prairie Chickens

DAKOTA DATEBOOK

Shooting prairie chickens was one of the premiere outdoor activities for hunters from the 1880s through the early 1900s. It was not always so, for when the great buffalo herds roamed through Dakota, the buffalo ate too much of the grass, and prairie chickens could not thrive. All that changed as the buffalo were wiped out in the 1870s and the last great herd was killed in 1883.

When farmers came, they planted wheat and small grains. Prairie chickens followed close after, nesting in the remaining grasslands and feeding in adjacent wheat fields. Prairie chickens proliferated as farmers killed foxes, owls and hawks, their natural predators.

“North Dakota is a wonderful place for prairie chickens,” said an expert hunter in 1883, “they live in the wheat fields, where they breed, and No. 1 hard [wheat] agrees with them.”

As farmers tilled homesteads in western Dakota, prairie chickens prospered in these “newer agricultural” areas. After August wheat harvests, the stubble-fields were “alive with prairie chickens” and the game-birds were said to be “as thick as mosquitoes.” In the best years, a hunter could “go into the fields and shoot his birds as he might do in a farmyard.”

Newspapers referred to the “festive prairie chicken,” as the feathered quarry became the “dainty dish” for great feasts. Eventually, the Game and Fish Department limited hunters to 25 birds per day, with a hunting season from August 20th to December 1st.

Sadly, over-harvesting made the birds scarce, and hunters in the 1890s generally needed a bird-dog to find them. When cropland replaced more grasslands, the prairie-chicken population dropped even further.

On this date, in 1909, the Grand Forks Herald reported that prairie-chicken hunting near Towner was “better than in any other part of the state,” but bird numbers were still very low, and it was clear that North Dakota would have to provide further protection for the species to avoid its extinction.

To improve hunting, the state Game and Fish Department began importing ring-neck pheasants and Hungarian partridges – and those birds largely replaced prairie chickens. Hunting season for prairie-chickens halted after 1945.

Thus, a small population survived, and today the “festive prairie chicken” may still be seen in grassy fringes near Grand Forks and in the Sheyenne National Grasslands by Wahpeton.
