•Hunters reminded to put identification on tree stands and blinds when set up on N.D. Game & Fish Dept. WMAs.

·Waterfowl hunters reminded to follow ANS regulations when hunting from boats.

game wardens: No new reports.

·Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Deepwater Bay continues producing walleye on the east end of Lake Sakakawea.

·Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea, Hwy. 83 Lawn & Leisure, Garrison: 3-foot drawdown continues on Lake Audubon into Lake Sakakawea so work around the culvert by the pumping station along the U.S. Highway 83 embankment for walleye. Douglas Bay continues producing walleye in 15 to 40 feet depending on wind. Try jigging raps or jigs and minnows. Continued salmon activity from shore around Government Bay. Try pitching jigs and minnows along points or back bays in 2 to 8 feet on Lake Audubon for walleye or the east side culverts going into Sakakawea. Continued bass success, as well. Try top-water baits in the early morning hours.

·Lake Sakakawea, New Town: A few anglers continue working the Van Hook Arm but generally slow walleye

•Missouri River, Dakota Tackle, Bismarck: Missouri River tailrace fair for a mix of species. Limited access south of Bismarck-Mandan with low water levels but some shore success for walleye. Try casting from shore for salmon in bays east and west of Garrison Dam on the east end of Lake Sakakawea. Work crankbaits deep on Lake Sakakawea for walleye but look for the lake to turn over soon and fish to move into shallower water. Lake Audubon OK for walleye.

•Missouri River, Enerbase of Washburn: Missouri River quiet with little activity

City: Limited activity on the Missouri River tailrace. Look for improving walleye success in shallower water with recent winds circulating water on Lake Sakakawea and potentially turning the lake over with cooler water and air temperatures. No new reports, however, after last week's winds. Try Scoria or Government bays for salmon from shore using variety of presentations.

 McLean Co. area lakes, Cenex of Wilton: Try Nelson Lake for walleye and bass.

Hunting:

•Deer: Becoming more nocturnal but still spread out.

·Pheasants: Continued fair success in many areas along with increasing hunting pressure.

·Waterfowl: Continued fair success for Canada geese and ducks around the east end of the Missouri River System with more snow geese starting to move in scattered flocks and more numbers in southern Ward County. First snow geese starting to move into the northwest with good numbers of whitefronts remaining. Good local duck numbers around north-central N.D. Northern mallards starting to move into the northern tier of the state with continued good success around the Devils Lake area.

Keep your immune system strong this fall

"Oh, no," I thought to myself. I woke up with a stuffy nose and a headache.

I have been on many plane trips lately. I heard some people in the airport coughing and sneezing. Some of the people sounded as though they should be in a hospital.

Did the prowling germs they were expelling find their way to me? Did I have a cold, the flu or something worse on the way?

With all the isolation and social distancing of the past couple years, I haven't had a cold or the flu in a long time. I had my annual flu shot later that week as a precaution.

We had turned on our furnace and the dry air probably led to my issues. I felt better after having a steaming hot cup of tea. To be on the safe side, I took it easy that day, drank a lot of warm beverages and let my immune system do its work.

Most of us get a cold or the flu on occasion. What's the difference, anyway? I visited the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention website for some clarification.

Flu is caused by influenza viruses, while colds can be caused by rhinoviruses, parainfluenza and seasonal coronaviruses. COVID-19 is caused by SARS-CoV-2, and that illness is different from the common cold or the flu.

Colds and flu share some symptoms such as fatigue, sneezing, cough, stuffy nose and sore throat, but the symptoms can be variable. See https://www.cdc.gov/ flu/symptoms/coldflu.htm to learn more

Getting the flu is more serious than getting the common cold. Flu symptoms often include fever, chills, cough, sore throat, runny nose, body aches, headaches, and sometimes, vomiting and/or diarrhea.

The flu can result in inflammation of the heart, brain and muscles. Serious bacterial infections, such as pneumonia, can occur after having the flu.

Specific testing is needed to determine if you have the flu or COVID-19.

Fortunately, for us, our bodies have a variety of disease-fighting cells and organs, including our spleen and bone marrow. Keep your immune system strong by following these tips.

Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds. Handwashing is considered the single most important way to prevent the spread of infection. If you are not close to a sink, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer according to the directions.

If you have a cold, be sure to cover your cough with your arm, not your hands. Better yet, stay home when you are ill and recuperate.

Eat a healthful diet full of colorful fruits and vegetables with lean protein, healthful fats, low-fat dairy and whole grains to round out your plate. Drink plenty of water too.

Be active at least five days per week, aiming for at least 30 minutes of physical activity per day.

Get plenty of rest. In general, people need seven to eight hours of sleep per night.

Search online for "NDSU Extension Nourish Your Immune System" for some of the specific nutrients your body needs to defend itself. Protein, vitamin D and antioxidants are among the key nutrients.

Soup is an excellent autumn food to enjoy. A steaming bowl of soup may help fight respiratory illnesses. This step-by-step recipe from our "Pinchin' Pennies in the Kitchen" series allows you to use what you have on hand to create a personalized soup.

Create a Soup in 7 Steps

- 1. Choose one fat.
- 2 tablespoons canola, sunflower, olive, vegetable (soy) or other oil

Heat in large pot on stove. 2. Rinse and chop one

medium onion. Add to pot and cook over medium heat until tender.

- 3. Choose one broth. Add
- 2 (16-ounce) cans chicken, beef or vegetable broth
- 4 cups water plus chicken, beef or vegetable bouillon or soup base prepared according to manufacturer's directions
- 1 (16-ounce) can crushed or diced tomatoes and 3 cups
- 4 cups milk and chicken bouillon or soup base prepared according to manufacturer's directions
- 4. Choose one protein. Add
- 1 pound cooked (or leftover) chopped/diced beef, chicken, ham, lean sausage, firm tofu,
- 1 (16-ounce) can beef, chicken, ham
- 1 (16-ounce) can beans (pinto, kidney, navy, black, etc.), drained and rinsed
- 5. Choose one starch. Add to pot.
- 3 to 4 cups diced potatoes
- 4 ounces egg noodles, macaroni, pasta (or 1S cups leftover cooked noodles)

1/2 cup uncooked rice (or 1 1/2 cups leftover cooked rice)

- 6. Choose a mixture of 2 to 3 cups chopped vegetables (fresh, frozen or canned). Add
 - 7. Choose one or more

seasonings, add to pot and simmer 20 to 25 minutes or until vegetables are tender.

1 to 2 teaspoons dried herbs (oregano, basil, cumin, chili powder, thyme, rosemary, parsley, etc.)

Bay leaf (remove before serving)

Minced garlic

1 to 2 Tablespoons fresh herbs (add five minutes before serving)

Belle Mehus DAKOTA DATEBOOK

A city is ever-changing and ever-growing. Businesses move around and eventually, one place becomes another, until soon, the city's face is transformed from what it has been a decade, a year or even just a month ago.

In Bismarck, there is a spot along Eighth Street and Rosser that housed many different activities. It was once the old Baptist Church. From there, it became the North Dakota Education Association. And finally, it was remodeled into a Conservatory—into Miss Belle Mehus' very own dreamconservatory.

On this day, movers were still unloading items into the new studio that would soon blossom under the guidance of her "family": It would become the personal quarters of Belle Mehus and her cat Rene, as well as a haven for the teaching staff of the Mehus Conservatory and their scads of students.

It was not the auditorium that Bismarck now knows; that's located on 6th Street. It was a little space full of her

"own ingenious, practical and imaginative ideas."

There was the curved staircase; the multi-colored, irregularly checked pattern of the carpet; the wrought iron railings; the soft green wallpaper "with gold floral tracery" adorning the walls. A mirrored wall in the reception room and the abundance of mirrors throughout the building "reflect Miss Mehus's conviction that they lend dignity and have a quieting effect on students."

Royal Hopkins selected "red corduroy for upholstery and drapery, modern paintings and a green carpet" in one room, while David Christiansen had not yet chosen what he wanted for dйсor in another, and in yet another, "Mrs. Bonnie Evans has the third studio, where tapestries and hangings will be used for decorative and acoustic effect."

In the "center of the stage" in each studio sat a grand piano, "with an upright in a supporting role." Each door also had soundproofing.

And in her own, specially

contrived space, Belle Mehus had a small but efficient kitchen, a bathroom with pink faucets, a display of her treasures throughout her personal domain, a picture of herself in her youth. No space seemed wasted.

The move in was six weeks behind schedule because everything was to be "just so," and there was a planned open house for November, but a behind-the-scenes preview of Belle Mehus' new conservatory was "interesting and revealing." Revealing, perhaps, because the choices reflected Belle Mehus herself.

They are not all pines **DAKOTA GARDENER**

As I sat down to write this column, I realized that it might be a bit confusing. As a scientist and a communicator, I try to be precise and specific in my word choice. That's a great goal, but it's not always attainable when working in natural systems. Scientifically, there's always an exception. Nevertheless, I hope you find this useful.

It was my first year at NDSU, and I received a phone call from a client. He said, "I have a fir tree. I think it's a spruce and it's loaded with pine cones." He wanted to know if there was anything wrong with it.

I was taken aback at first, but through some back-andforth discussion, we figured out what was going on. It was a spruce tree that had a lot of spent pollen 'cones'. This is normal behavior for a tree at that time of year and nothing to worry about.

But I was still confused about his use of the words fir, spruce and pine, to describe a single tree. Fir, spruce and pine are all conifers, but each one is unique and they can't interbreed. They're all different species.

So, it's time for a brief lesson on the conifers of North Dakota.

The most common conifer trees planted in North Dakota are pines (ponderosa and Scotch pines) and spruce, such as Colorado (blue) spruce and Black Hills spruce. Yes, there are certainly others mixed in, but these are the most common. They're all conifers but they're not all pines.

Pine trees are in the genus Pinus, and they have relatively long needles that are held in clusters called fascicles. Ponderosa pine generally has two or three needles per fascicle and the needles very long-4 to 9 inches long. Scotch pine trees have two needles per cluster, the needles are about 1.5 to 3.5 inches long and they're twisted around each other.

Spruce trees are in the genus Picea and they have shorter needles that are held individually on each twig. Colorado (or blue) spruce needles are about 1 to 1.5

inches long and are really sharp. Blue spruce is definitely a poky tree! Black Hills spruce has needles that are a little shorter, about 0.75 to 1 inch, and they're not sharp.

Unfortunately, not all blue spruce are blue. Sometimes they're more greenish and even the Black Hills spruce can be a little blue. So we use other characteristics to properly identify these species.

Correct tree identification is a challenge but it's critical. For example, tree species are sometimes very specific in where they can grow. If we tried to plant the spruce or the pines in a wet site, the trees would die. Only a limited number of conifer species can grow in wet sites. Most will drown out if their root systems get flooded.

Also, certain insects or diseases are specialists and hit only specific types of trees. Yellow-headed spruce sawfly is an insect that attacks only spruce trees. It doesn't hit pines. Western gall rust, on the other hand, can be found on ponderosa and Scotch pines, but not on the spruces.

I try not to get too bothered about improper usage of the scientific terms used in identifying trees. I'm a forester and trees are what I study, day in and day out. It's a pretty unique occupation, especially in North Dakota. And in all my 20 years at NDSU, I still haven't figured out how to tell the difference between wheat and barley. Something about the beards or the awns?


There's always something new to learn.

Fall pruning can sometimes result in desiccation of the pruning wounds over the winter.

If it has been a number of years since your last soil test, consider sending a sample from your garden to a local soil testing lab. We are seeing more and more vegetable gardens that have an excess of phosphorus which can lead to stunting of vegetable plants and a general failure to thrive.

Finally, make a list of your favorite vegetables or annual flowers that you tried this year. Trust me, you won't remember the names by next spring.
