Outdoor Notes:

 Reminder that most roads and trails closed to hunting if posted on both sides.

•Check all PLOTS signage before driving on with vehicles when waterfowl hunting to ensure landowner allows vehicles.

•Hunters reminded to put identification on tree stands and blinds when set up on N.D. Game & Fish Dept. WMAs.

·Waterfowl hunters reminded to follow ANS regulations when hunting from boats.

•N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: No new reports.

·Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Some continued walleye activity on the east end of Lake Sakakawea prior to the weather change but little activity since then.

·Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea, Hwy. 83 Lawn & Leisure, Garrison: East end of Lake Sakakawea producing walleye in Douglas Bay prior to the weather change and wind. Try vertical jigging with minnows in 25 to 30 feet. No reports from Lake Audubon.

·Lake Sakakawea, New Town: Continued fair walleye success in the Van Hook Arm, weather permitting. Work a variety of depths with fish transitioning into shallower water and on the move.

•Missouri River, Dakota Tackle, Bismarck: Little activity on the Missouri River.

•Missouri River, Enerbase of Washburn: No new reports with little activity on the Missouri River and area lakes.

·Missouri River System, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River tailrace remains slow although some continued catfish success with limited angler numbers. East end of Lake Sakakawea producing scattered walleye activity but limited anglers. Better success remains west around Beaver or Beulah bays.

Fewer salmon anglers, as well.

·McLean Co. area lakes, Cenex of Wilton: Some activity on Lake Sakakawea before the weather front moved through.

Hunting:

·Pheasants: Generally fair to good success but some areas spotty and better than others with increasing pressure in many areas.

·Waterfowl: Pockets of waterfowl across east-central N.D. but hunting pressure moved many local birds out. Look for increasing bird movement with recent weather front. Continued fair to good waterfowl success around the Devils Lake area with snow geese moving into northeast N.D. Not much movement yet south of Garrison Dam along the river but good snow goose numbers along areas east of the Missouri River System and central N.D. as well as northern McLean County and southern Ward County. Nice duck numbers, as well. Fair duck numbers in north-central N.D. Increasing numbers of swans and cranes moving into northwest N.D.

Missouri River system remains in drought

September precipitation is almost a 20 percent increase was once again below average in the Missouri River Basin. September runoff in the Missouri River Basin above Sioux City, Iowa was 0.6 million acre-feet, 47 percent of the longterm average. Soil conditions in the upper Missouri River Basin continue to be very dry.

According to the Drought Mitigation Center, over 90 percent of the Missouri River basin is currently experiencing some form of abnormally dry conditions or drought, which

from the end of August.

"Runoff in the upper Missouri River Basin was below average during the month of September and is expected to remain low throughout the rest of 2022," said John Remus, chief of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Missouri River Basin Water Management Division.

The 2022 calendar year runoff forecast for the upper Basin, updated on Oct. 1, is 19.5 MAF, 76 percent of average

and 0.7 MAF lower than last month's annual runoff forecast. Average annual runoff for the upper Basin is 25.7 MAF.

Total System storage as of Oct. 5 was 48.5 MAF, which is 7.6 MAF the base of the flood control zone. Due to the extremely dry conditions in the upper Missouri River Basin, the System is expected to lose an additional 2.0 MAF before the 2023 runoff season begins in March of 2023.

Sports enthusiasts may remember that the Green Bay Packers defeated the New England Patriots in the Superbowl. Pete Sampras and Martina Hingis each won Wimbledon.

Mother Theresa, Princess Diana, John Denver and James Stewart were among the notable people who died.

Of course, many other events occurred in 1997. In North Dakota, we fought record flooding that year. We all built new "sandbagging muscles" as we gathered by the Red River. Automated sandbagfilling units were developed later.

On a personal note, my son was just two years old. In the next eight years, we would welcome two daughters.

Also in 1997, I began writing this "Prairie Fare" column.

"Writing a weekly column is a grind," the editors warned.

I was perplexed. They were the ones who suggested that I write a column. I guess they were being realistic.

"I'll give it a couple months and see if any paper runs the column," I said.

For the first couple of years, I was the co-author with an editor who had a background as a chef. Back then, the final edited columns were sent as printed copies through campus mail, not as emails.

This is a food and nutrition column, after all, so here are four tips for planning a healthy celebration.

1. Try to incorporate three or more food groups into celebration menus.

Provide a variety of colorful fruits and vegetables.

Provide whole-grain options, such as whole-grain crackers or popcorn.

Include a dairy food or other calcium source, such as mozzarella cheese cubes or yogurt parfaits.

Include a variety of protein options, from lean meats to beans and other pulse foods in dips and appetizers.

2. Be creative with your food displays. "Charcuterie" boards were not well-known 25 years ago, but people enjoy the artful arrangements of cheese, meat, nuts, fruits, vegetables, breads and crackers.

3. As you prepare your celebration recipes, consider making healthful swaps. For example, nonfat yogurt can be swapped for sour cream or mayonnaise in dips. About half of the white flour in many recipes can be swapped with whole wheat flour. About half of the oil and other fat in some baked goods can be swapped with apple sauce.

4. Don't forget to include options for people with special dietary needs, such as gluten intolerance, lactose intolerance and allergies to nuts. For more information about food allergens, visit the NDSU Extension website at ndsu.ag/food-allergens.

I bet you are expecting cake for this celebration. I'm providing a chocolatey dessert dip to enjoy. The 2023 calendar has a fudgy black-bean brownie recipe, by the way. Any food can fit, in moderation, in a healthful diet.

Chocolate Dessert Hummus

1 (15-ounce) can chickpeas, drained and rinsed

1/3 cup honey

1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder

1 S teaspoons vanilla 1/4 teaspoon salt

3 to 4 tablespoons water

Foods for dipping (fresh

fruit such as strawberries, graham crackers, vanilla Drain and rinse chickpeas,

and place in a food processor. Place all other ingredients into the same food processor and puree until a smooth texture is visible. If needed, add additional honey one tablespoon at a time until desired sweetness level is met. Serve with fruit such as strawberries, graham crackers.

Makes 11 (2-tablespoon) servings. Each serving has 70 calories, 0.5 grams (g) fat, 14 g carbohydrate, 2 g fiber and 105 milligrams sodium.

The Great Pumpkin for North Dakota DAKOTA GARDENER

Do you believe in the Great Pumpkin?

Linus from the Peanuts cartoon believed. Instead of trick-or-treating with Charlie Brown, Linus spent every Halloween night in a pumpkin patch waiting for the Great Pumpkin to appear.

The ghost never came, but Linus never stopped looking.

Since 2009, a team of more than 100 families in North Dakota have been looking for a great pumpkin in their backyard gardens. They have tested pumpkins that are orange, white and gray. They have tested pumpkins that are big and small, round and flat, smooth and warty.

Their favorite pumpkin variety is Neon, the Great Pumpkin for North Dakota.

These families are amazed to see bright-orange, glowing pumpkins in their gardens in August, while other pumpkins are still green.

Neon pumpkins are guaranteed to ripen before Halloween, even in the far northern regions of our state.

Another nice feature of Neon is its compact habit. The vines of Neon only spread about eight feet across. They won't overrun the garden and can be grown in small spaces.

Neon pumpkins are a nice size for a jack-o'-lantern. They grow about 10 inches across and weigh about 8 pounds. Although these pumpkins are not huge, your kids will be delighted. The handles are dark green and strong.

If you are looking for a bigger pumpkin and have room in your garden for the vines to spread, a variety called Howden is the classic pumpkin.

Breeders in North Dakota have developed an early strain called Early Dakota Howden.

This organic variety has performed well in trials across

Other strong performers in North Dakota include Early King and Early Giant. These varieties are easy to grow, ripen early and produce deeporange jack-o'-lanterns.

If you want to get your kids really excited, grow a monster pumpkin.

Atlantic Giant grows the biggest pumpkins, often exceeding 200 pounds. But these pumpkins require a tremendous amount of care. You will need to start seeds indoors, sacrifice most of your garden space, trim vine roots, pick off little fruits, provide shade to the enormous pumpkin and water almost

In the end, you will get a big, ugly, lopsided, pale-orange pumpkin. Plus, you will need a tractor to move it out of the garden. That's too much work and not enough reward for many of us.

An easier option is to choose giant pumpkins that require no special care. The Big Moose variety produces eye-catching, red-orange fruits that may reach 100 pounds. It's highly recommended.

Large Marge and Howden Biggie reliably reach over 30 pounds. If you want to try something different, grow Polar Bear, a pure-white giant pumpkin.

You can search these varieties online and find several seed companies that sell them.

King John Satterlund DAKOTA DATEBOOK

Washburn, the oldest city in McLean County, was founded on this date in 1882. The man responsible was John Satterlund, who, by the time he died, was known across the state as "King John."

Satterlund immigrated with his parents from Carlstadt, Sweden, when he was 18. He was smart, well educated, and a risk-taker. The family settled in Minnesota, but John headed west, ahead of the railroad. when he was 22. He established his first homestead 15 miles north of Bismarck, at a spot called Dry Point, and then headed north to Canada to help build the railroad between Port Arthur and Fort Williams. When he returned four years later, he bought a large chunk of land in Burleigh County and got serious about farming and ranching. But it didn't appear to satisfy him.

He soon speculated on property farther north and planned out the city of Washburn. He became one of the first commissioners for Burleigh County and then set his sights on breaking away to form McLean County, with Washburn as the county seat. Satterlund served as the new county's first sheriff and was also a U.S. Marshal for four years.

Continuing his trail blazing, Satterlund opened a roller mill, in Washburn, and the Merchants Hotel in Bismarck. He established the first Bismarck-Washburn stage line and, with his long-time friend Louis Peterson, brought in the first telephone service between the two towns. Satterlund was also the editor and publisher of his own newspaper, the Washburn Leader, and was the receiver in the Bismarck land office for 12 years. And if that's not enough, he owned his own coalmine—the well-known Black Diamond.

Not to say Satterlund had no private or social life. The Bismarck Tribune reported, "...one of those astute popular leaders in his heyday, Satterlund was said to know more men by name than any of his contemporaries..." He was popular about town and belonged to the Elks and the Masons. On the home front, he and his wife, Charlotte, raised five children.

It's no surprise that Satterlund also got into politics. He was twice elected to the state legislature and soon concentrated on getting handpicked men into office. One of his good friends was a U.S. senator from Wisconsin – C. C. Washburn – for whom his town was named. In fact, it was Washburn who was able to give King John the one thing he didn't have – a railroad line into town.

But not everybody admired Satterlund. Bismarck's Alexander McKenzie was also in his heyday during this time, and the two political bosses often locked horns – especially when McKenzie's powerful machine tried to cross the county line into Satterlund's turf. The Tribune states, however, "...never did Satterlund quail or recede from McKenzie's forays into his territory."

A 1930 obituary gives us a hint that King John was, of course, not perfect. At the time of his death in December 1930, he'd been seriously ill for a year. He had a daughter living nearby, yet he was living alone in the Grand Pacific Hotel in Bismarck. Charlotte was gone – having moved to California to live with another daughter.

"There have been many instances of misused authority in the summing up of Satterlund's life," the obituary reads, "but the good that might be said of him far outweighed the balance. He was the product of an era when [bosses were] good for the country... He was of the old school, a real man, and McLean county regrets his passing."

The McLean County Fair Board has purchased a 22,500 square foot lot for \$1,800 from the City of Underwood. The lot, located at lot 1, Blk 1 of Stewart's second addition, is currently leased to the Fair Board from the city and is used for parking.

The fair board decided to purchase the property after some buyers showed interest in the land.

"I went to the fair board and just let them know that there were some people showing interest in the property," Underwood City Auditor Courtney Blotske said. "Their lease agreement gives them first right of refusal on the purchase of the property."

Additionally, the fair board hopes to buy a second, larger lot from the city. The lot is used mostly as a staging area for the trailers and cars during the McLean County Speedway races. Currently, it is not platted, and a city road runs through the lot. The city's engineers are developing plans to present to the commission for the platting project.

The fair board's budget is part of McLean County's overall budget.

GK Chesterton once said, "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting. It has been found difficult and left untried."

I'm not one to blow smoke. I mean I'm not the kind of man to skirt around issues pretending that everything is hunky-dory when it's not.

On the other hand, I am not a doom-and-gloom, no-hope-fortomorrow naysayer, buying into or promoting all the latest "sky is falling" news out there.

It goes without saying that there are some people who seem to make a living speaking nonsense; even telling people living in certain situations that there's hope when there is no

Speaking nonsense is not for me. It shouldn't be for you either.

Our Lord Jesus Christ never spoke in any way that lacked credibility; and he doesn't allow his disciples to speak falsely either. He said what he said and he meant it.

When he spoke about letting children come to him freely. he meant it. When he taught that marriage is between one man and one woman, he meant it. When he commanded His disciples to baptize in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, he meant it.

When he warned us that in

If you and I claim to be followers of our Lord Jesus, then we had better speak honestly and live our lives only in ways that are not only credible but absolutely truthful.

Years ago smiley-faced neo-Christians ran around with little trendy plastic bracelets on their wrists with the letters WWJD on them. These letters stood for "What Would Jesus Do?" I never liked those bracelets because most young people wearing them began to rationalize away their actions mistakenly believing Jesus would approve.

I recall one young woman who was into all kinds of immoral behavior telling me with a straight face, "God loves me just the way I am." Apparently she thought there's a correlation between love and approval.

While it is true that God loves everyone, and we certainly cannot quibble about this, it does not follow that God approves of all the choices that we make.

Today, we had better ask what did Jesus say? Christians must be honest about Jesus. Christianity is divided because some Christians have not been honest about what Jesus truly said and what he meant. We cannot hope for anything good in this life, or in the next, if we are in a state of being unwilling or unable to believe the truth that he taught.

If the ideal of Christianity will truly be tried again, there will be hope. However, if we will not bend our wills to what Jesus taught, then truly there will be no real hope for the world. On the other hand, real hope exists when, like our Lord Jesus himself, we cry out, "Not my will but yours be done, O Lord!"
