

Jim Jam Jems **DAKOTA DATEBOOK**

Sometimes the truth hurts, and even offends, but that didn't stop Sam Clark and C.H. Crockard, publishers of Jim Jam Jems from writing the truth in a blatant manner.

The magazine's forward warned of the material enclosed in Jim Jam Jems's colorful cover: "Here in the confines of this little booklet, we can say that which appeals to us, without fear of the result....Here we will let our imagination run riot;...we intend to write just whatever we damn please and say just as much....Kind reader have a care; if you are one of those 'holier-than-thou' individuals who dislike plain unvarnished truth, then delve no farther into this volume, for what is written here may shock your immortal soul, may shatter your faith in humanity and forever damn you-damn you."

The publication was widely read, but at least one "holierthan-thou" individual delved too deep. This week in 1912, Clark and Crockard were

indicted by the federal grand protect the home by putting jury in Fargo for sending obscene and immoral reading matter in interstate mail. Meanwhile, news dealers throughout the state and in Minneapolis and St. Paul were also being arrested for selling the publication. Jim Jam Jems, however, continued "selling like hot-cakes," and Clark and Crockard continued publishing to circulate, however, and the booklet throughout the

Clark and Crockard was in no way obscene and even and social commentary. Their commentary, however, often turned to those in charge, whether it was the church or political officials. To the state, however, the publication was obscene, and the District Attorney's intention was to

the publishers out of business.

For the next five years, Clark and Crockard contended the conviction, and the trials often flopped back and forth between guilty and not guilty. The legal battle finally ended December 1917 when they were

Jim Jam Jems continued Clark and Crockard retained the colorful voice in later issues. Clark later moved to Minneapolis, and began taking on other endeavors. He spent less time on the publication, and the August 1929 issue was the last of Jim Jam Jems.

Prostate Cancer: Know Your Options

Over my 30 year career as a cancer physician I have witnessed firsthand the tremendous progress in treating cancer patients. There continues to be controversy in the screening and treatment of prostate cancer (PC) for which I am grateful to have the opportunity to share more information with you.

PC screening consists of obtaining a PSA and rectal exam, followed by a biopsy if indicated. In 2012, the United States Preventive Task Force (USPSTF) recommended against PC screening. Studies following their recommendations demonstrated a substantial decline in both PC screening and diagnosis of early stage PC, and a subsequent increase in the rates of more aggressive PC. In 2017 the USPSTF reversed their prior recommendation, listing PSA as a reasonable screening test in men ages 55-69.

For men with early stage PC, active surveillance is recommended that includes obtaining a PSA every 6 months and a repeat prostate biopsy 1-2 years later. For patients who require treatment surgery and radiation are equivalent options. Many patients in the US and in SD only hear about these options from the urologist who performed the biopsy. There are advantages and disadvantages for both approaches.

Patients deserve to hear about both treatments before making a decision that impacts their life. One of the most effective radiation options for earlier stages of PC is prostate brachytherapy (BT) or "seed implants" for appropriate patients. This is a one hour outpatient procedure that yields some of the highest cure rates. Multiple studies have demonstrated quality of life and patient satisfaction favors BT and is the most costeffective treatment.

A significant area of controversy is the management of aggressive PC as we are now seeing more of these patients due to the previous lack of screening. A misconception in the medical community is that these patients should all be surgically treated. While

surgery is an appropriate option, many patients still require 6 weeks of radiation to eliminate cancer left behind with higher rates of incontinence and impotency. Another proven treatment option is daily external beam radiation followed by BT that produces some of the highest cure rates. The recurrence rates are lowest with this

approach compared to surgery. Unfortunately, many patients in the US do not have access to prostate BT, especially in rural areas. The only radiation option for them is 8 weeks of daily radiation which can be a dilemma with the travel required. Prostate BT was previously performed at cancer centers in SD, but is now only available in Rapid City.

Selective prostate screening and treatment reduces PC death rates. Proper patient selection is critical when deciding on treatment. Thoroughly informed patients who consent to treatment are less likely to

regret their medical decisions. Patients deserve to know their options.

Prepare and store wild game safely

"Watch out for deer!" my parents would say when I left after a weekend at home during college.

I knew to drive slowly and be observant, especially at dawn or dusk.

I looked for glowing eyes in the ditches along wooded areas on my drive back to college. If you see one deer, most likely that deer has some companions.

Sometimes I would see a herd of 100 or more deer looking at me from a corn field. They were eating well.

We had a couple of near misses when deer jumped in front of our vehicles.

By the way, the State Farm Insurance Company reported 1.5 million animal collision claims from 2019 to 2020. If you hit a deer, move your vehicle to a safe place and stay away from the injured animal. Laws vary from state to state, so call local authorities. You might also need the incident report for your insurance company.

During the fall deer hunting season, deer are moving. I grew up in a wooded area surrounded by farm fields. The deer herds and some moose knew a good habitat.

In full disclosure, I do not hunt. I know many women enjoy the sport. However, I have helped prepare many kinds of wild game from birds to venison (deer meat).

Game meats are good sources of nutrition. A 3S-ounce portion (before cooking) of game meat such as venison provides about half of the daily adult protein requirement and 130 to 150 calories. They are a good source of iron and other minerals. Game meats usually are slightly lower in total fat but higher in polyunsaturated fats than grain-fed beef.

Remember food safety all the way from the field (or store) to your table. Hunting and processing your own wild game could introduce some food safety hazards unless it is carefully done, especially when the outside temperatures are warmer than usual.

The same types of safe handling rules apply to game meat as other types of meat. These are some tips to consider for animal proteins, whether they are the result of a successful hunt or you purchased the meat in a grocery store.

For immediate use, store the meat in the refrigerator and use within two or three days. Keep raw meat and cooked meat separate to prevent crosscontamination.

Freeze game properly. Prevent "freezer burn" by using the right packaging materials.

Divide meat into meal-size

quantities.

Use moisture/vapor-proof wrap such as heavily waxed freezer wrap, laminated freezer wrap, heavy duty aluminum foil or freezerweight polyethylene bags.

Press air out of the packages prior to sealing.

Label packages with contents and date.

Avoid overloading the freezer. Freeze only the amount that will become solidly frozen within 24 hours.

For best quality, game will keep three to four months in the freezer if properly wrapped.

Do not can meat unless you have a pressure canner.

Low acid foods, such as meat and most mixtures of foods, should never be canned using the water-bath method.

Pressure and adequate time are necessary to produce safe canned meat. For the latest canning information, contact your county NDSU extension office.

Thaw frozen meat in the refrigerator or microwave oven. Cook game meats thoroughly.

Foods thawed in the microwave oven should be cooked immediately. Refrigerator-thawed meat should be used within one to two days.

Game meats should be cooked to an internal temperature of at least 160 F to reduce risk of foodborne illness.

Big game animals usually exercise more than domestic animals, so game meats may be drier and less tender. Moist heat methods such as braising (simmering in a small amount of liquid in a covered pot) may result in a better product. Chops and steaks may be pan fried or broiled.

The distinctive flavor of game meats is mainly due to the fat they contain. To reduce the flavor, which some people label "gamey," trim the fat from the meat. You may wish to add other sources of fat to maintain the juiciness of the

Spices or marinades may be used to enhance the flavor. Meat should always be marinated in the refrigerator.

Cranberries, an American tradition

With Thanksgiving fast approaching, we turn our attention to preparing one of the year's great feasts. The turkey is the neutral palette against which the side dishes reign supreme. Each year, I make a refreshingly tart cranberry sauce from scratch. Many of us take cranberries for granted but this fruit has a fascinating history and production method.

Were cranberries served at the first Thanksgiving? No printed menu exists from the 1621 Thanksgiving in Massachusetts but it is feasible that the Wampanoag tribe may have brought cranberries to the feast. Cranberries are one of the few fruits that are native to the United States and were prevalent on the East Coast.

The history of cranberries doesn't begin in 1621. The Wampanoag and other tribes have been gathering these nutritious berries for hundreds if not thousands of years. The fruit was eaten in a number of different ways

including fresh, dried, and baked into fritters.

One of the more innovative uses was to mix dried venison meat, fat and crushed cranberries to make pemmican. Arguably, this could have been the world's first protein bar. The fruit's acidity along with the meat fat prevented the pemmican from spoiling and this portable product could be taken on long trips.

Cranberries are still a culturally important crop for the modern Wampanoag tribe. They have inhabited Massachusetts for more than 12,000 years and have a long history of gathering cranberries for the winter. To this day, the Wampanoag celebrate Cranberry Day each October. Children have a school holiday to gather with their elders in the local bogs to harvest berries and preserve their traditions.

Most individuals have never seen cranberries growing in the wild, because they grow in wetlands called bogs that have sandy, acidic soil. The optimum soil pH for cranberry production is astonishingly

acidic and is comparable to acid rain. Considering that most soils are alkaline in the northern Great Plains, this precludes cranberry production in our region. Wisconsin is by far the largest producer of cranberries followed by Massachusetts, Oregon and New Jersey.

Both wet and dry harvesting methods are used in commercial cranberry production. We've all seen the cranberry juice commercials showing berries floating on water. For the lower-cost processing market, farmers flood their fields at harvest to a depth of 18 inches; the water is churned to shake the berry from the vine, and the cranberries, which each contain an air pocket, float to the surface. Then the farmers use a boom to gather the floating berries.

For the higher-quality fresh market, farmers use lawnmower-sized harvesters to painstakingly pick the fruit. This process is very labor intensive and leaves a lot of berries in the field. The woody cranberry vines grow in moist soils but are not

submerged in water during the growing season because they would die.

Acidic foods cut the richness

of fatty dishes that we serve at Thanksgiving. Consider adding a colorful cranberry chutney to complement your turkey, pork chops or ham.


