





Outdoor notes:

•Ice is never completely safe. Avoid areas with vegetation, moving water, pressure ridges, and springs. Check conditions as you go along on the ice and don't move around at night.

•Reminder that it's illegal to chase, harass, or pursue any wildlife species with motorized vehicle.

•Dec. 30: Missouri River Canada Goose Zone season closes.

•Dec. 30: Light goose season

•Dec. 31 & Jan. 1: Free fishing weekend. N.D. residents can fish for free.

A White Christmas

Those dreaming of a white Christmas got more than they bargained for on this day in 1916. In what was considered at the time the worst storm in 48 years, western North Dakota was bombarded with 20 inches of snow and 36 mile an hour wind gusts.

The snowfall began early afternoon on Christmas day, and continued through the night, dropping eighteen inches of snow by noon. Trains were snowbound for nearly two days, and taxis and cars in Bismarck were forced to drive on sidewalks in places where snow was too deep on the streets. It wasn't long before travel in the city was restricted entirely to sleighs and bobsleds. Because streets were totally impassable from downtown to the capitol, even the governor and other state officials bundled up for a sleigh ride to their office:

Perhaps the sleigh ride was cold, but businessmen could work in their warm offices. Other workers, however, had to battle the elements. As the storm raged, adults found themselves busy with making snow tunnels and ice fortresses—activities that are usually reserved for children and their imaginations. But these adults had to make their snow creations on a much larger scale. Snow plows

were busy across the state carving tunnels through 13to 15-foot tall snow banks for trains. Meanwhile, Bismarck firefighters faced a larger task: forming a giant ice shield on a building to protect it from a downtown fire.

Late on the night of the 26th, a fire broke out in downtown Bismarck. Firefighters were called down to battle the flames that were fanned by the strong gale. Fighting fire with water was difficult in the subzero temperatures, as water froze instantly to their clothes. "Firemen in jackets of ice, moving about as human icicles, fought the fire under the direction of Chief Thompson in a blizzard considered the worst since 1896," reported the Bismarck Tribune. The fire was already burning about a quarter of a block and firemen struggled to keep it from spreading. The only way to stop the flames, for the firemen to turn their water hoses to a building in path of the flames.

instantly, preventing the flames from the yards from taking a hold," said the Tribune. "This morning ... the structure looked as though a temporary ice palace had been erected by the firemen to stave their drive ... The coat of ice given this building held the fire in its limits of devastation, and was a remarkable piece of work on the part of the firemen."

For those who experienced the blizzard of 1916, the lyrics, "I'm dreaming of a white Christmas, just like the ones I used to know," just might not have the same meaning for others. This is especially true for those who are disgruntled by the memories of brown Christmases of the last few

Stay motivated to maintain your fitness this winter PRAIRIE FARE

Every morning when I arrive at work, I come to a fork in my path.

It's not a real fork. This week's column is not about food.

As soon as I walk into my building, I have to make a choice.

I can take the elevator, which is a few steps directly to my right. Or, I can walk up the stairs, which are directly ahead of me.

My office is on the third floor of my building. Accumulating some steps when taking the stairs is better for my health.

Some days, the elevator wins. After navigating the sometimes-icy sidewalks on the way to my building, I may not be motivated. The soles of my boots often may be caked with snow and ice.

I use the elevator when I have several bags or a cartload of supplies to return to my

I am glad the elevator is convenient for everyone who enters our building. Some people have injuries or disabilities.

I just have excuses some

Winter is a time when

accumulating 30 minutes of moderate physical activity on most days of the week can be challenging. Maintaining healthful eating and regular physical activity go hand in hand with maintaining or improving our health throughout the year.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, physical activity has immediate and long-term benefits.

A single time of getting moderate to vigorous physical activity can improve the quality of our sleep. It can reduce anxiety and lower our blood pressure.

If you want to reduce your risk for several chronic diseases, aim for regular physical activity. It can be accumulated in small chunks throughout the day.

For example, getting regular physical activity can reduce your risk for depression, dementia and potentially Alzheimer's disease. Regular physical activity can help prevent heart disease and diabetes.

If you want to reduce your risk for eight types of cancer, get regular physical activity. Researchers have shown that regular physical activity can reduce your risk for cancer of the bladder, breast, colon, endometrium, esophagus,

kidney, lung and stomach.

As we move toward New Year's resolutions, be aware that physical activity, along with healthful eating, can help with weight management. Weight-bearing exercise such as walking can improve your bone strength and can reduce your risk of falls.

How are you doing with physical activity? The experts at CDC recommend accumulating 150 minutes of moderate intensity physical activity every week, along with two times of musclestrengthening training. For example, the moderate activity could be a 30-minute walk one day and a 15-minute jog another day.

We face some obstacles to outdoor fitness during winter months in the Midwest, so these are some ideas to keep yourself moving even when the thermometer dips.

Park farther from your destination. In cold weather, bundle up with a heavy coat, boots, mittens, hat, hood and/ or scarf.

Take the stairs when possible.

Make wintry weather your friend. Consider learning how to cross-country ski, snowshoe or ice skate. Remember that snow shoveling is exercise, but follow the tips in the NDSU Extension publication, "The

Scoop on Snow Shoveling Safely" at ndsu.ag/shoveling.

Find a buddy to keep you motivated. Schedule physical activity with your buddy. The walks can be indoors at a school or mall or other facility that allows walkers. If you have a gym membership, a friend can help you stay motivated.

If you have a sedentary job, try to stand up a few minutes every hour. Even better, get up and walk around a few times

If you have a sedentary job, have "walking meetings" instead of sitting at your desk. Adjust your camera and stand or walk in place during online

meetings.

Consider getting a standing desk and/or using an exercise ball as your chair for part of the day. An exercise ball may help with good posture because you could "roll off" your chair if you are not supporting yourself.

If walking is a challenge or not possible for you, consider chair exercises and strength exercises. See the NDSU Extension publication "Stretching Toward Better Health" at ndsu.ag/stretching. It includes photos of easy physical activities to motivate you to retain your range of motion and flexibility regardless of your physical

abilities.

Be sure to stay hydrated regardless of the season of the year. A warm beverage such as hot cocoa or herbal tea can warm you after being outside. Here's an old recipe that still remains popular.

Spiced Tea Mix

- 1 1/2 cups orange breakfast / drink powder (such as Tang)
- 3/4 cup iced tea mix (unsweetened)
 - 1 1/2 cups white sugar
 - 3 teaspoons ground cinnamon
 - 2 teaspoons ground cloves

Mix contents in a large bowl. Store mixture in an airtight, quart-size container. Decorate container as desired.

For each serving, place 1 cup boiling water in a mug and stir in 1 to 3 teaspoons of mix (to taste).

Makes 64 servings. Each serving (3 teaspoons of mix) has 60 calories, 0 grams (g) fat, 0 g protein, 10 g carbohydrate, 0 g fiber and 0 milligrams sodium.

End of the year reporting

For the next couple of weeks, I'll be working on my end-of-theyear reports. It's a great time to reflect on what went well and what could have gone better. I thought that the reports would provide a good foundation for this month's column.

But let's face it – reports are boring. Instead, how about some highlights!

This was the 30th straight year that I planted at least one tree in the spring. In 2022, I helped plant nearly a dozen new trees at the Myra Arboretum near Larimore, in western Grand Forks County. I'm excited to see how the Northern Empress® Japanese elm does in the coming years. This cultivar is an NDSU release that has outstanding burgundy color in the fall. Check out Myra next summer; it's a great place to visit.

During late summer, I helped some colleagues at the University of Minnesota on a genetics study of our native highbush cranberry, also called American cranberry bush. This is not the cranberry that we eat at Thanksgiving. Instead, it's a viburnum. The fruit is a beautiful red color and very tart. The study aims to determine how closely related the American cranberry bush and

the European cranberrybush are. The berries from the European shrub are poisonous.

On a totally different note, diagnosing tree health problems takes up a lot of my time each year. This past summer was no different.

Drought-related tree stress dominated in 2022. Besides direct damage from the drought, two pests in particular increased this year – bronze birch borer (BBB) and Valsa canker of spruce.

Both of these pests are strongly associated with drought. If there's enough moisture, the trees can fight off the pests. Therefore, management is pretty simple – prevent the pests in the first place by properly watering your birch trees (BBB) or spruce trees (Valsa).

On a positive note, emerald ash borer has still NOT been found in North Dakota. Thank you to all the cooperators out there who've been keeping a great lookout for this pest. Someday, when this destructive insect establishes in North Dakota, it will have the potential to substantially change our native forests, urban forests and shelterbelts. Thanks especially to the North Dakota Department of Agriculture and the North Dakota Forest Service for their

efforts at insect monitoring and trapping.

All end-of-the-year reports include a section on next year's plans and goals. I enjoy that part of the process as it allows me to think big. It's funny though – the calendar year is different from the fiscal year. And the state's fiscal year is different from the Federal fiscal year. It can get a bit complicated.

Do trees have a fiscal year? Sort of.

The amount that trees grow in our region is strongly linked to available moisture. However, soil moisture and its availability do not follow the calendar year. Instead, they follow the "water year," also known as a hydrologic year.

Precipitation that falls in October through December of a given year isn't going to help trees grow that year. Instead, it's best-linked to growth the following year. Thus, the amount of precipitation in the water year – October through September of the following year – is the best predictor of tree growth in our area.

It's like a carryover from one year's annual budget to the following year.

May you have a big carryover of peace and joy in your annual budget for 2023. Wishing you all a great new year.

PRAIRIE DOC PERSPECTIVES

Advances in surgery

My son is one of the many Americans with cleft lip and palate. The specifics of each affected individual's situation vary, but one thing they have in common is that they will be having surgery. Lots of surgery. Although most individuals with orofacial clefts, including my son, are otherwise healthy and lead normal lives, the process of restoring a normal smile, normal speech, normal chewing, involves many steps from birth into adulthood.

Most of his surgeries have blurred together in my mind, however, his first bone graft remains starkly vivid.

In this surgery, bone is removed from the hip for implantation in the ridge under the nose, where your front teeth are anchored. The pain where the bone was removed was excruciating. He was hospitalized for four days, and once home we struggled to keep him comfortable despite acetaminophen, ibuprofen, and two different opioids.

We were understandably dismayed ten years later to learn he would have to undergo this procedure again. Not enough bone had grown from the earlier graft to support the next stage of the repair.

It was with great trepidation that we checked into the hospital for surgery earlier this summer. Despite the reassurances of our surgeon, we both expected the same gauntlet we had faced last time. We were wrong.

In the intervening years, a new delivery system for an injectable anesthetic had been developed, and then approved for use in young people. His surgeon used this medication at the graft harvest site. The difference was almost inconceivable. He needed minimal supplemental pain medication during our single night in the hospital, and once discharged took only the occasional dose of Tylenol or Motrin. I suspect those doses were prompted mostly by the fear that it might start to hurt more, and not by pain

Like all of medicine, surgery has experienced change at an ever-accelerating pace, but the apparent "revolutions" are built on a foundation of stepby-step science. In medical school, I watched the first laparoscopic nephrectomy performed at the University of Iowa, a major tertiary care center. This amazing "new" technology could trace its history back nearly 200 vears, to a German doctor who invented a primitive precursor. Advancements in both medicine and technology have brought us to today, when endoscopic, laparoscopic, and robotic surgeries have become commonplace.




