



OUR OUTDOORS

I crossed the finish line inside the Fargodome a few weeks back at the start of the first nice day this non-winter season conveniently had offered up and checked the exercise app on my watch, which was tracking my effort. It read 1:41:33 as I clicked the End button on the display. If correct, I bested my half marathon time by more than four minutes. The next day, I checked the official results on my phone and it displayed a time of 1:41:26, which worked out to a pace of 7'45" per mile; not too shabby for a flat-footed 44-year-old who weighed nearly 250 pounds in his junior year of high school. When asked why I run and work out with a heightened level of diligence here in middle age and now 70 pounds lighter, I often cite back to those days as one of the primary reasons.

Just prior to the weekend's running festivities, I led my vellow lab to the black matted scale at the veterinarian's office to get his annual shots so he'd be able to visit the boarding facility once again and maintain his overall health for the upcoming fall hunting season, avoiding summer nasties like heartworm carried by mosquitoes and tickborne illnesses. Ole is a large creature, and he's been that way from birth, able to rumble through cattail sloughs carving a walking path at least big enough for me, and sometimes even another hunter. By the time he was two years old, he had settled into that 100-to-105pound range, so it's never a shock to see triple digits show up on the LCD display at the vet.

While it's a trite excuse to say Ole is big-boned, he truly is. He's also quite muscular, but has a notable layer of fat as well, and if there were a dog fashion runway, he'd likely be the king of the plus-sized models - still good looking, but noticeably bigger than his contemporaries. So, when the display bounced from the upper teens, then into the low twenties and finally settled back down onto an even 120 pounds as he plopped his behind down on the scale, even I gasped audibly. He was up 13 pounds since the prior spring, and I struggled to come up with an explanation.

With my wife's German shepherd, we walk five times a day religiously, covering the block with such regularity that I consider us to be the

every pheasant call, from the raspy one on the far side of the draw to that dominant one of the big, backyard-safe bird which patrols the lawns on the east side of the street. My dog's bluffed charge frequently sends that rooster with what looks to be a 28-inch tail feather back down into the small drain at the end of his suburban domain, no matter how distant we are from him. As the saying goes, birds don't get that big by being stupid; but apparently all the walking wasn't stopping my dog's size increase.

In the morning, when the two dogs are eating after our first walk of the day, they like to trade bowls repeatedly. The shepherd is particular and waits until Ole has first eaten some kibble before she nudges him out of the way, and he goes to the other bowl. I don't know if she's having him check it for poison, like I often do with my kids' chicken nuggets, but it's obvious that Ole doesn't mind being the guinea pig for the day's feeding if he gets a few extra bites. The extra caloric intake settled in my mind as a likely source of my lab's weight gain, but there was certainly another one.

Following a 20-inch snowfall the first week in November and a few follow-up weather events, which basically shut down much of our hunting efforts until a few perilous cross-state journeys to less-covered lands, our outings in the field were limited to early season trips for grouse and pheasants in September and October respectively. Where least one weekend day until the upland season's end on the first Sunday in January, we didn't after the snow fell.

In those treks, we typically cover miles and miles and miles of terrain. We hunt hard. Up hills, through brush, and deep into tangled sloughs. Like me, Ole doesn't fear the sweat equity that comes with going to those places birds tend to be, plowing through hell to find upland heaven. It's on those journeys that we use up our extra calories, where every mile of blacktop under my running shoes from the summer and under his polar-bear-sized paws in each daily walk pays off, especially in the late season when snow often mandates the additional physical effort. We're always ready for it. But when nature takes away half or almost two-thirds of that season, it's easy to see the results of a more sedentary lifestyle, comparatively speaking.

So with the vet's advice of a more monitored feeding program, and the hopes of a longer upland season than the previous one, we enter the summer, with me looking to maintain my pace and weight from a winter of monotonous treadmill running into a summer out in the open, and Ole looking forward to a a seasonal slimdown, chasing bird dummies in the backyard and shedding a couple extra pounds ahead of a long autumn afield. Through that combination we both hope to find a balance, and put to rest these weighty issues next fall...in our outdoors.

Hindered by pain in your heel?

"How are you? Does Midwestern politeness get in the way?"

Midwest Culture is unique. We "America's Heartlanders" are known for our outdoor hobbies, farming, winter survival strategies, hard work and country living. We are also known for our politeness. It is at times an autopilot response to hold a door open, greet another with a smile, drop off treats for a neighbor or when running into someone familiar ask, "how are you?" How often have we asked, "how are you" and heard the answer, "good" or "fine" or even answered this question ourselves this way.


Unfortunately, "Midwestern Polite" has also created a belief that if we truly answer the question, "how are you" with honesty, we are burdening others. For this reason, we often answer "good" or "fine" when maybe in fact, we are not. This is called passive communication. Passive Communication is when we do not express our feelings or needs, do not believe our feelings or needs matter equally to others, or often we find ourselves apologizing for things. Overtime this passive communication style often leads to misunderstanding, anger or even resentment.

This is where it is vital for us to understand emotional and social wellness skills. To learn that every single one of us as humans has feelings and that this is normal. The more we ignore these feelings the more we impact our overall health.

Having the skills to be able to truly answer the question, how are you, requires emotional wellness skills. The skills of recognizing one's feelings, understanding those feelings, labeling them, expressing them and regulating them. This skill, known as the "RULER' skill is an acronym for the five evidence-based skills of emotional intelligence (recognizing, understanding, labeling, expressing, and regulating) founded by psychologist Marc Brackett out of Yale University. This skill is not a skill we are born with. This skill provides a sense of understanding and control of what is going on within us. Emotional wellness skills aid in our overall ability to manage stress, communicate effectively and manage conflict which supports our overall physical wellness.

So, the next time a kind Midwesterner asks, "How Are You?" I encourage you to be honest. I encourage you to use the skills of checking in to recognize how you really are feeling, labeling it and expressing it to that person asking. The other wonderful value we South Dakotans have is showing up for one another. We are not a burden. We are wonderful Midwestern neighbors who show up for each other. Let's continue to work on defining and modeling that "Midwest Nice" as honest and authentic support.

DAKOTA GARDENER BY CARRIE KNUTSON, HORTICULTURE AGENT Amazing apples

gardener's best friend.

This beneficial insect is like the sheriff in our gardens, protecting our plants from aphids and other bad bugs.

Ladybugs have voracious appetites, too. One ladybug can eat 50 aphids a day and over 5,000 aphids in its lifetime.

Although ladybugs are our friends, don't buy them for your garden. You will be wasting your money.

There are dozens of different species of ladybugs (more properly called lady beetles) in the Dakotas. The most commonly sold lady beetle is the convergent lady beetle.

These lady beetles eat heartily during autumn in the valleys of the western United States, develop a fat layer in their bodies and then fly up nearby mountains to hibernate.

The beetles sleep together in huge clusters of up to 40 million. While sleeping, they are harvested with portable vacuums, refrigerated and then packaged for sale.

The biggest problem with buying lady beetles is the insects still think they are hibernating in the mountains. When they wake up in nature, they migrate for miles down to the valley before feeding again.

The same thing happens with purchased lady beetles. Studies have shown that purchased lady beetles will fly for miles after being released, burning up their fat layers before eating insects or laying eggs.

Within 48 hours, less than 5% of the lady beetles you release in your garden will remain. Some of these may have been injured when shipped.

Even if a few lady beetles remain for a few days, they are not hungry and are not likely to lay eggs in your

> Another limitation is the convergent lady beetle almost exclusively eats aphids. It doesn't like to eat cabbageworms, potato beetles or cutworms, for example.


> Instead of buying sleeping lady beetles from California, it makes more sense to provide an environment that is inviting to our local lady beetles.

> Lady beetles will feed on nectar and pollen. You can attract them with flowers such as dill, coriander, alyssum, sunflower and yarrow.

> Minimize the use of persistent insecticides that threaten our lady beetles. If a pest outbreak occurs, use a shortlived and relatively safe insecticide. Spinosad and neem can kill pests while posing a minimal risk to lady beetles.

> Lady beetles are our best friends. You can't buy friendship. Best friends are priceless.

In general, buying lady beetles and other predatory beneficial insects have their limitations in open gardens. You need to have lots of pests in your garden for the predators to eat. Once these pests are eaten, the predatory insects will fly away from your garden to look for more food.

Concerns have been raised that the natural habitat of lady beetles is being damaged in harvesting operations. Furthermore, scientists have expressed concerns that the distribution of harvested lady beetles


