

Audubon *Lakes Sakakawea, Hwy. 83 Lawn & Leisure, Garrison: No reports from the east end of Lake Sakakawea but anglers continue working the midsection around the New Town area for walleye with fair success.

*Lake Sakakawea, New Town: Continued fair to good fall walleye bite using jigs and minnows in 14 to 30 feet, weather permitting.

*Missouri River, Dakota Tackle, Bismarck: No reports from the Missouri River Bismarck-Mandan around with a few anglers still going south around the state line.

*Missouri River, Enerbase of Washburn: No activity on the Missouri River or area

*Missouri River System, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Try the spillway channel from boats in the afternoon and evening for walleye on the Missouri River using jigs and minnows. A few fish taken shore-fishing or from the wing walls. Overall limited angler numbers, though. Lake Sakakawea quiet.

*McLean Co. area lakes,

Cenex of Wilton: No new reports from the Missouri River or area lakes with the slow transition to ice-fishing.

Hunting:

*Deer: Late rut still lingering earlier in the week for muzzleloader season.

*Upland: Fair numbers remain in some areas.

*Waterfowl: A lot of ducks moved off Lake Sakakawea but Canada geese still lingering and scattered along the lake's open water around the midsection and east end. Few birds remain in the northwest and they moved out of north-central N.D. Most Canada geese and diving ducks moved out of east-central N.D. with a few scattered birds on Devils Lake. Geese along the Missouri River System don't have much of a feeding pat-

DAKOTA GARDENER

BY CARRIE KNUTSON, HORTICULTURE AGENT A hoya addition

Gardeners must give off the impression of being plant care takers. This has to be true, as I have been gifted one more houseplant. This makes four total in the past year. It is hard to say no to a plant, especially when it is a plant that you don't have already.

My mother "gifted" me a very large hoya plant she received from a friend. She didn't like the plant and wanted it out of her house. I was horrified for the plant's fate and didn't want it put in the dumpster. The plant is quite stunning. It has mainly white and green variegated foliage, but occasionally there are leaves with pink and green variegation. So, the plant made the trek to my office before the weather got cold.

Hoyas are sometimes called wax plants, wax vine or porcelain flower. They are in the same family as milkweed. There are a few hoya species in the houseplant industry, with many cultivars and varieties with different colors and leaf textures.

Hoyas are native to Australia and have thick leaves that are covered with a waxy layer. The waxy layer helps the leaves retain moisture. They have a vining growth habit and grow quite long. My rescued plant has long vines, six or more feet in length.

I did have to cut a vine as it grew through an eye hook on a wall hanging. It was a vine that had the pink coloration. Luckily, hoyas can be propagated by stem cuttings. My cutting is in a small vase of water with a new developing root.


Hoyas are described as an easy-care plant, as they are treated like a succulent. Hoyas like well-drained soil, so use a cactus or succulent potting soil mix. Keep the soil moist but not wet. If the leaves start to curl or have a limp appearance, it is time to water. Hoyas prefer bright indirect light and are slow growing.

Hoya flowers have a sweet smell and develop on the ends of vines. New hoya growers are warned not to trim off the bare vine ends, as flowers will form year after year from this area. I can't wait for my hoya to flower. Happy gardening!

PRAIRIE FARE

Gift-giving season includes gift drawing for readers

"I think it's time to leave," I said to my husband.

My husband picked up our kid, who could transform into a marble statue or a column of wiggly jelly.

At this moment, our kid was a screaming two-by-four tucked under my husband's arm enroute to the car.

This was a little embarrassing. We had been looking at the toy section. Our child wanted a particular toy right then.

Eventually, our child learned that the "screaming statue" tactic resulted in our leaving the store immediately.

Now that our kids are in their 20s, selecting gifts isn't as easy as a trip to the toy store. Gift cards seem to be a logical choice that allow people to choose what they want. Sometimes, however, gift cards get tucked in a drawer and are found much later, if ever.

According to a Credit Summit survey of 1,200 consumers, half of consumers lose their gift cards. An estimated \$21 billion is tied

up in unused gift cards.

While gift cards are appreciated by many, what are some other gifts for adults? If you give gifts for the holidays, consider a few ideas and free online resources from NDSU Extension.

1. Give a gift that promotes safe food preparation. A food thermometer, an apron and a set of potholders are usually welcome additions to a kitchen. Grilling enthusiasts might enjoy longhandled food turners. If you like to sew, you can make the potholders and apron in the favorite colors and design of the recipient.

See www.ag.ndsu.edu/food and check out the "Home Food Safety" section for handouts about thermometers, food storage and more. They are free to download and share.

2. Create a cookbook of favorite family recipes. If you have the actual recipes in the handwriting of a relative, photocopy or scan them to make an extra-special keepsake. Add some digital photos of the recipe writer.

Although great-grandma's home food preservation recipes might be tempting to share, we caution against sharing "old" food preservation recipes. Cookie and cake recipes usually are fine to share, but food preservation research has led to changes in our recommendations.

Be sure to compare "old" canning recipes to current ones.

Sometimes, canning recipes withstand the test of time, but often they do not. See ag.ndsu.edu/food and go to "Food Preservation" for the latest information.

3. Consider a gift that helps you avoid food waste. We all have experienced increased prices at grocery stores. Unfortunately, an estimated 31% of food is wasted at the retail level or at home according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service.

Let's work together to avoid throwing away edible food. How about a new set of microwaveable bowls, freezer containers and/or an insulated lunch bag to make use of these "planned-over" foods? Consider composting leftover food scraps, such as potato peelings.

See the "Food Preparation" section at ag.ndsu.edu/food. The "Pinchin' Pennies in the Kitchen" series of publications have ideas to make foods from what you have on hand. These can be printed into a booklet of ideas.

growing gardens.

How about some beverage, soup or bread mixes as gifts for family and friends? We have several "quick mixes" (at ndsu.ag/quick-mixes), which can be made as a recipe or layered in a jar for a gift mix.

Herb Quick Bread

2 cups all-purpose white flour 1 cup whole-wheat flour

1 tablespoon baking powder 3 teaspoons caraway seeds

½ teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon ground nutmeg

½ teaspoon dried thyme

If making a gift mix, layer the recipe ingredients in a clean quart-

sized jar. Cover the jar tightly with a lid, decorate if desired and attach a copy of the recipe card.

1 recipe/jar Herb Quick Bread mix

1 egg

1 cup fat-free milk 1/3 cup canola oil

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a mixing bowl, whisk together dry ingredients. In a separate bowl, whisk the egg, milk and oil. Add the wet ingredients to dry ingredients and stir until moistened. Place mixture in a 9- by 5-inch loaf pan coated with nonstick cooking spray and bake for 40 to 50 minutes. Cool for 10 minutes in pan; remove from pan and place on a wire cooling rack.

Makes 16 servings. Each serving has 140 calories, 5 grams (g) fat, 4 g protein, 21 g carbohydrate, 1 g fiber and 180

milligrams sodium.
