

DAKOTA GARDENER

My wife and I have a couple of really cool apple trees in our yard. Each tree has multiple varieties grafted onto the main stem. I haven't counted lately, but I think one of the trees is up to about a dozen different varieties. The harvest is different each year, which is fascinating.

Right now, though, certain branches are still holding onto their leaves, while others have lost them all. Most deciduous trees, including apples, should have lost their leaves by now, so this isn't normal. What's going on?

Quite simply, those specific branches didn't harden up completely for winter. This tells me that those varieties are borderline hardy for our area. They really need a longer growing season, and a long autumn that allows them to go dormant naturally. They rarely get those conditions in our area, as we're so far north.

Yet other varieties go dormant just fine. It's crazy.

I've noticed a lot of other trees around that haven't lost

their leaves. For some species, this is perfectly normal, as they hold onto their leaves into winter naturally, even though they're fully dormant and hardy.

Ironwood is one species that has this characteristic of holding onto its leaves in the winter. The technical term for this is "marcescent." It's a normal behavior for ironwood and several of the oaks.

Other things can cause trees to hold onto their leaves well into the winter. Some diseases or insects can kill or damage leaves to the point where they don't fall off their branches in autumn. Those branches might not survive over the winter and therefore won't grow new leaves next spring.

At the other extreme, we sometimes water and fertilize trees too much and they won't shed their leaves naturally. It sounds counterintuitive. How can giving the tree the things it needs for growth and health be causing a problem?

Quite simply, too much wa-

ter or fertilizer keeps trees vegetative – growing – well into the fall and they don't harden up in time for winter. I often recommend that people avoid fertilizing after July 4, and apply some drought stress to their trees in August, to slow down their growth.

It seems illogical, but stressing the trees a little bit in late summer helps them go dormant on time.

Let's go back to those branches on my apple tree that are still holding their leaves. What should I do?

Really, there's nothing I can do. Those branches didn't harden up properly and all I can do is wait. Removing the leaves, one by one, won't change anything. I'll just wait for nature to take its course and the leaves will likely fall off in early spring.

There is one thing I can do for the apple trees to help them survive the winter. Protect them from rabbits! But that's a whole different story.



*Ice is never completely safe. Avoid areas with vegetation, moving water, pressure ridges, and springs. Check conditions as you go along on the ice and don't move around at night.

*Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Weather permitting a few anglers continue boat fishing for walleye around Deepwater Bay on Lake Sakakawea and west in the midsection. Some walk-on activity for walleye on the east end of Lake Audubon but ice conditions can vary and use extreme caution, testing ice depth along the way. Try jigs and minnows.

*Lakes Audubon & Sakakawea, Hwy. 83 Lawn & Leisure, Garrison: No activity on the east end of Lake Sakakawea, including in any of the back bays with open water. Some walk-on activity on the east side of Lake Audubon for walleye but use extreme caution. Try the coal veins and stumps from boats on the Missouri River below the tailrace for walleye.

*Lake Sakakawea, New Town: Weather and ice conditions permitting, the midsection continues producing walleye from boats using jigs and minnows/Access conditions could change rapidly if weather turns more seasonable and ramps ice in and poor conditions prevent ice-fishing.

*Missouri River, Dakota Tackle, Bismarck: No Missouri River reports.

*Missouri River, Enerbase of

Washburn: Area lakes remain quiet as anglers generally wait for better ice conditions.

*Missouri River System, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River producing small walleye during the day, boat access permitting off the ramp if it's not iced in. Also try the chutes at night but overall angler numbers are light. Lake Sakakawea quiet with open water

*McLean Co. area lakes, Cenex of Wilton: Anglers starting to walk onto the back bays of Lake Audubon. Try minnows or nightcrawlers and jigs for walleye.

FROM A CERTAIN POINT OF VIEW

45 years of Truth, Justice, and the American Way

When it comes to superheroes, almost all of them have some kind of origin story. The origin story of how I became a die-hard fan of superheroes began when I was very young. Many may remember that our local grocery store used to have a VHS rental store where the produce section is now. Two VHS tapes fascinated me when I was younger, a movie called "Spider-Man" starring Tobey Maguire and an animated movie called "Batman Beyond". I found myself asking my mom to rent them every time we were in the grocery store, before she finally broke down and bought those tapes, and I've been obsessing over superheroes ever

It wasn't long afterwards when Superman became a favorite of mine. Often, there would be re-runs of the cartoon "Justice League", where Superman was the team's leader. While I really enjoyed those, it was a few years later when I received a box set of Superman movies for Christmas starring a man named Christopher Reeve that made me a die-hard fan of the Man of Steel.

"Superman: The Movie" starring Christoper Reeve, Gene Hackman, and Marlon Brando will celebrate its 45th anniversary on December 15. It's one of my all-time favorite movies, and a lot of that is owed to how the title character is portrayed by actor Christopher Reeve. The first half of the picture explores how he became the Man of Steel. As the film reaches its midpoint, we see the Caped Wonder rescue people for the very first time. His first daring rescue occurs when newspaper reporter Lois Lane is in a helicopter during a freak accident and is trying not to fall and Superman flies in just in time to save her. When she asks him who he is, he simply replies "A friend". This simplistic but powerful line is quickly backed up by the Man of Steel's actions a few short moments later. As he flies around making daring rescues, he comes across a young girl trying to retrieve her cat that's stuck in the tree, and he takes time out of his busy schedule to help this girl. The scene is simple, yet so effective. This interpretation of the iconic hero is all about being a friend, someone who's there to help people no matter what, and give people a sense of hope.

Christopher Reeve returned as the title character nearly three years later in "Superman II". The most powerful moment featuring our heroic protagonist happens at the end of the picture. The main villain, General Zod, and his two henchmen wreak havoc throughout the United States,

including the White House before they finally encountered the Man of Steel. In the film's epilogue, we see Superman retrieve the American flag that's supposed to be on top of the White House, and return it back to its proper place. He once again brings a sense of hope back to a nation that was forced to see the terror that General Zod brought.

I believe that this version of the character is still relevant today. Superman declares that he stands for truth, justice, and the American way. He is full of kindness and decency, acting as a friend to all the citizens who need his aid. All these wonderful traits combine into a symbol of hope in my opinion, and hope is a trait that is so important in the world we live in. Superhero movies like these two are why I love our costumed heroes; they remind us that no matter how bleak the situation is there is always the hope that good will triumph over evil in the long run.
