"Although there is a lot of work involved with the cup, I love it!" Pfliger stressed.

About Joyce

Pfliger was born and raised just east of Garrison near Lake Audubon.

After high school graduation, she attended St. Mary's School of Practical Nursing in Pierre, SD.

nament director Jim Fischer said they needed help collecting prizes for the anglers and asked if Pfliger could help.

She agreed. Pfliger became committee secretary in 1983, and later chairwoman in 2005.

She is the only woman to ever head up this committee.

And she doesn't only work on this event during tournament time; this is a year-round job for Pfliger. She is totally invested in this tournament and tries to provide a positive experience for all participants every year.

"Although the Governor's Cup began as a small derby, comprised of friends and neighbors, it has grown into a field of 260 teams with several states involved," Pfliger said. "I have met so many amazing people, with some becoming lifelong friends."

"Pfliger's dedication to the North Dakota Governor's Walleye Cup Fishing Tournament is obvious, and her thousands of hours of effort accompanied by her friendly, personal touch has ensured the continuing success of the tournament," ND Fishing Hall of Fame President Keith Witt said in a press release about her induction. "Her commitment to the tournament while ensuring a positive experience for all involved has provided significant benefit to sportfishing in

North Dakota."

Pfliger was surprised to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.

"Never did it cross my mind," Pfliger said. "I feel very fortunate to be included with the awesome people who have proceeded me in being inducted."

Through her activities involving tournament preparation as well as during the tournament itself, Pfliger has many interactions with tournament competitors, and they often express appreciation for the personal touch that Pfliger provides and have developed personal friendships with her.

As of this year, there have only been two women inducted into the ND Fishing Hall of Fame.



50 YEARS AGO

Plans Complete for the First Governor's Walleye Cup Derby

July 17, 1976

A flotilla of over 100 boats will be poised in deTrobriand Bay south of Garrison early Saturday morning awaiting the signal from starter Mike Zimmerman to get the First Annual North Dakota Governor's Walleye Cup fishing tournament underway. With that signal some 100 two-man teams will set course for areas which they hope will yield the elusive walleye which may earn them a portion of some \$7,000 in cash and prizes being awarded at the conclusion of the Sunday evening,

The tournament, which becomes a reality through the combined efforts of a number of Garrison businesses and civic organization, the American-Lund Boat Co., the State Game and Fish Department and Gov. Arthur Link, will run June 19-20 from 7 a.m.- 5 p.m. Prizes will be awarded to the fisherman landing the largest walleye and to the top teams registering walleye by total weight. Top prize for the largest walleye is a Lund boat and Gator trailer. The next nine teams will receive cash prizes ranging from \$475- \$250.

Minot television sportscaster Russ Smith will be guest speaker at the pre-tournament banquet slated for the Garrison American Legion building Friday at 6:30 p.m. where all entrants will receive the tournament rules and regulations.

Teams representing governors of Montana, South Dakota, and Minnesota will compete with designates Mr. and Mrs. Walter Hjelle, representatives of Governor Link, in quest of the Governor's Cup, which goes to the team landing the most total pounds of walleye in the two-day event.

Launch site for the event will be on the east shoreline of Fort Stevenson State Park which will also offer fishermen camping facilities during the tournament.

The Big Lake Is Still Master But-

June 24, 1976

While most entrants were finding it tough to land a single fish, a Bismark father-son team of Joe and Terry Schneider landed one elusive walleye after another over the weekend to claim top honors in the two categories of the first annual North Dakota Governor's Cup Walleye Derby held on Lake Sakakawea.

For their performance in the two-day event, the Schneiders "took everything but the lunch tent" they claimed a pair of Lund boats and Gator trailers and \$500 for the top prize based on total poundage of fish and added another boat the trailer combo after weighing n the largest walleye of the event.

The Bismarck anglers weighed in 33 pounds, 3 ounces of fish in the total weight division and claimed top honor in the larg-

est fish category with a respectable 3 lb. 3 oz catch.

Nearly 20 pounds behind the winners in second place were Fargo anglers Bob Schmidt and Glen Lien, who weighed in 13 pounds, and 14 ounces of walleyes. They did, however, earn then \$500 in runner-up money.

Area anglers, especially those from the Garrison area, ran into a near shutout in the event as the few fish taken were definitely in the "small" walleye class. There had been claims by some "locals" would dominate the event despite the fact that Lake Sakakawea poses problems for all anglers.

The Schneiders' key to success appeared to be the use of nightcrawlers fished in water six to 15 feet deep.

Deja vu- Siegel, Schimdt win N.D. Governor's Cup

The 25th Anniversary of the North Dakota Governor's Cup Walleye Tournament is history, and like it's 1997 counterpart, Kenny Seigal and Thomas Schmidt of Mandan are the reigning champions.

The duo made the most of their catch, turning in just nine fish equaling 43.28 pounds. This is only the second time second time there has been repeat champions in the tournament. The only other team to repeat as tournament champions was the tandem of Joe and Terry Schneider of Bismarck.

Minoters Joe Dittus and Marty Anderson claimed second place. The Magic City team netted a full 12 fish limit with a total of 39.82 pounds.

The top local team was the brother team of Brian and Todd Gehring. The Garrison duo placed fourth with 12 fish equaling 38.10 pounds.

Last year's champions, Galen (Hap) Munz and Rod Huston, finished in 44th place with 10 fish equaling 25.84 pounds, just out of the money. (The tournament pays out to 42nd place.)

"We were sitting in better shape than

anyone else," Siegel said, noting they could catch up to eight more fish, while other teams in the hunt had caught more fish during first day action.

Tournament Director Jim Fischer said the 25th anniversary edition of the Governor's Cup Walleye Tournament was "excellent."

"The tournament went real smooth," he said. "The weather really cooperated this year."

A total of 1,761 fish were caught during the two-day event totaling 3,871.8 pounds. The average weight per team was 15.9 pounds, with the average walleye weighing 2.2 pounds.

Keith Altendorf, who landed an 8.13-pound walleye on Friday, caught the largest walleye. In noting the winning team's bait of choice,

Siegel emphatically said crank baits. "We used them 95 percent of the time."

Besides being crowned the Governor's Cup champions, the two also were crowned winners of the mini tournament of past Governor's Cup winners.

BY KAREN HEINZEN It's time to hit the big waters as the 25th annual North Dakota Governor's Cup Walleye Tournament is just ahead. The tournament is scheduled for July 21-22 at Fort Stevenson State Park.

Just as past years have done so, top prize for the Governor's Cup is \$6,000 with second place finishers at \$2,250 and third \$1,650. Prize money is paid through 42nd place.

Flighting will start at 7 a.m. at Fort Stevenson State Park Marina with successive flights leaving every half-hour.

With 252 teams to compete in the tournament, the event will be a catch and release derby with a maximum 12-fish weight-in. A total of 10 fish can be caught on either day.

For this year's silver anniversary derby, past winners of the derby will be entered into

a "winner takes all" tournament. Approximately 20 past winners are returning to participate in the event. The mini-tournament has a separate entry fee and payback said Governor's Cup Coordinator Jim Fischer.

He said extra money could be won at the derby as well.

Fisherman may also register for the optional Hall of Fame Tournament. The tournament is a tournament with-in the Governor's Cup.

The Hall of Fame tournament is an opportunity for funds to be raised for the North Dakota Fishing Hall of Fame.

Fischer said new things are happening with the tournament this year.

"Prizes will be given away for special things that happen during the tournament," Fischer said, "like \$25 to the 25th place team."


